Group Leader Volunteer Information

For students who have completed 6th – 12th grade Safety Town is a nonprofit educational program geared toward five year old children. The curriculum involves a variety of a safety topics and issues. As a Group Leader, you will receive lesson plans on these topics and you will follow the direction of the lead teacher.

Safety Town will be held at Dunwiddie School from June 11-21, 2019. There will be two sessions, one from 8:00 to 10:00 a.m. and the other from 10:30 am. to 12:30 p.m. You will need to arrive at Safety Town at least 30 minutes before the session begins to receive instructions for the day. You may work all morning at both sessions or work for only one of the sessions. Priority in the selection process will be to those individuals who can help at both sessions for the entire two weeks.

Being a Group Leader at Safety Town is a very important job. The young children need to establish a good relationship with you and they look forward to seeing you each day. We need to know we can depend on you to make a commitment to work through the entire two weeks at Safety Town. As a Group Leader, you and a partner will be assigned to a group of five or six children. Each day, you will meet with your group at a house in Safety Town. Next, you will follow a schedule for the day which may involve listening to speakers such as crossing guards, police officers, or a firefighter; watching a video; touring the district pool and Aquatic Center, or visiting a playground to discuss safety issues. You will help teach safety songs and poems. We will also have time to let the children drive cars on our Safety Town set up outside on the playground.

This is an opportunity for you to gain job experience and a reference for your future. Your full attention will be needed to help in teaching and watching the children to keep them safe. Your commitment means you will be devoted to paying attention to the lead teacher and the students, not being distracted by texting on a cell phone or talking with other Group Leaders. **YOU** make the difference in this program and in helping to make it a success for the young children attending.

If you enjoy working with young children and would like to be involved in Safety Town, **please complete the enclosed application and return it to Brad LeDuc, by May 1st.** We will consider the applications and call students to determine who the best volunteer candidates might be.
